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Designing a Bag

SEWING: THE BASICS

Fastening your thread when you begin sewing On the back of your work, sew 3 tiny stitches on top of one another.

Joining 2 pieces of material

Make a seam using <u>back stitch</u>. Keep your stitches less than half a centimetre long on the right side.

Fasten your thread on the wrong side.

Then bring needle up to front at 1.

Put needle down at 2.

Come back up at 3.

Put needle down again at 2.

Come back up at 4.

Put needle down again at 3.

Continue in this way.

Cross stitch

Fasten your thread on the wrong side of your work then bring your needle up to the front at 1. Then put the needle down at 2.

Come back up at 3. Go down again at 4.

Come back up at 5. Go down again at 4.

Come back up at 1. Go down again at 6.

Continue in this way. Keep all your stitches the same size.
