Nouns that end in a vowel and y	add <mark>S</mark>	boy - boys; day - days; key - keys
Nouns that end in a consonant and y	y becomes ies	baby - babies; spy - spies; country - countries
Nouns that end in f or fe	f or fe becomes ves	elf - elves; loaf - loaves; thief - thieves
Nouns that end in O	add <mark>S</mark>	piano - pianos; video - videos
Certain nouns that end in a consonant and o	add <mark>es</mark>	hero - hero <mark>es;</mark> potato - potato <mark>es</mark>

Some nouns change a vowel sound when they become plural. Some examples include man - men; mouse - mice; tooth - teeth

Some nouns do not change when they become plural. Some examples include deer, fish, sheep and species.

Some nouns have plural form which are left over from Old English which include child - children; goose become geese and ox - oxen.
