**VERB: To do (Present tense)**

I do

You<sub>ONE</sub> do

He/she/it does

We do

You<sub>MANY</sub> do

They do

**VERB: To do (Past tense)**

I did

You<sub>ONE</sub> did

He/she/it did

We did

You<sub>MANY</sub> did

They did



**VERB: To do (Future tense)**

I will do

You<sub>ONE</sub> will do

He/she/it will do

We will do

You<sub>MANY</sub> will do

They will do

Present, past and future tenses - VERB = To take

**VERB: To take (Present tense)**

I take

You<sub>ONE</sub> take

He/she/it takes

We take

You<sub>MANY</sub> take

They take

**VERB: To take (Past tense)**

I took

You<sub>ONE</sub> took

He/she/it took

We took

You<sub>MANY</sub> took

They took

**VERB: To take (Future tense)**

I will take

You<sub>ONE</sub> will take

He/she/it will take

We will take

You<sub>MANY</sub> will take

They will take
